INSTRUCTIONS: This section is open to anyone with a physical or developmental disability. All projects may be completed using hand over hand if needed. There is no age limit for this section; all crafts can be completed by any age person. Please include age on back side of the tag. For further rules and information, please read the instructions CLASS 44 Junior Crafts.

SECTION:

1. Fall Paper Plate Wreath – create a fall coloured wreath using different a medium and a paper plate no bigger than 9” in diameter.
2. Nature Mobile – Using things you find outside, create a nature mobile. Use any medium to decorate your mobile.
3. Tissue Paper Art – make a fall tree using ripped tissue paper. Not to exceed 8 1/2” x 11”.
4. Thanksgiving Table Decoration: Using a mason jar and wheat and/or flowers, make a decoration for the Thanksgiving table. Use any medium to decorate the jar. (Wheat and flowers may be real or fake).
5. Friendship Bracelet or Necklace – make a one-of-a-kind friendship bracelet or a fantastic necklace using beads or other decorations.
6. Clay Pot Pumpkin – Paint a 3” or 4” clay pot to look like a Hallowe’en pumpkin
7. Golf Ball or Ping Pong Ball Painting – create a painting using golf balls or ping pong balls. Not to exceed 8 1/2” x 11”.
8. Bumble Bee Clothes Peg – using a clothes peg, pom-poms and any other medium, create a bumble bee note holder.
9. Coffee Can Bee – use any mediums to decorate a coffee can to look like a bee.
10. Fall-in-a-Bottle – Fill a clear 2 litre plastic bottle with things that remind you of the fall season.
11. Fall Finger Print Tree – create a beautiful fall coloured tree. Use your arm and hand as the trunk and branches and your fingers as leaves. Not to exceed 12”x12”

12. Toilet paper Bumble Bee – Using a toilet paper roll, construction paper and paint or markers, create a bumble bee.
