INSTRUCTIONS: The Junior sections are for boys and girls who have not reached their 16th birthday by the first day of the fair. Please fill out the information on the entry cards and include the child's age to be visible when the card is folded. Fasten entry tags securely to all entries. No entries will be accepted for more than two years. All entries must be the work of the child. Parents are encouraged to allow the children to prepare the exhibits without assistance. Please encourage them in every way, but remember that every bit of work you do for them defeats the objectives of the Fair. Only one entry per section per child permitted and children must exhibit in their own age group only. ALL PICTURES AND PAINTINGS MADE ON PAPER MUST NOT EXCEED 8 1/2 x 11 INCHES UNLESS OTHERWISE NOTED. PLEASE READ INSTRUCTIONS FOR EACH SECTION AS THEY WILL BE DISQUALIFIED IF NOT MADE TO THE APPROPRIATE SIZE. No exhibitor fee is required, however all exhibitors must obtain an exhibit number before entering their items. Entries must be placed in the Exhibit Hall by 10:00 am Friday and not removed until 4:45 pm Monday following the Awards presentation. Please ensure that you arrange to have your entries picked up as we cannot be responsible for them after Monday.

Examples of any medium, would be; paint, markers, crayons, pencil crayons, oil pastels, bingo dabbers, chalk, ribbon, yarn, string, lace, feathers, buttons, pompoms, stickers, paper, fabric, noodles, shells, puzzle pieces, flowers, beads, sparkles, sequins, tooth picks, pipe cleaners, googly eyes, popsicle sticks, foam pieces, clothes pins, wooden spoons, dice, play dough, felt, sponges, elastics, milk tags, gimp, items from nature, cotton balls, egg cartons, candies, etc.

Ages 2 and under: PLEASE INDICATE AGE ON OUTSIDE OF ALL ENTRY TAGS AND MAKE SURE ALL RULES HAVE BEEN READ AND FOLLOWED.

- 1. Marble Painted Leaf create a fancy maple leaf by rolling marbles and paint over it.
- 2. Paper plate bumble beef using any size paper plate make your best bumble bee using any medium.
- 3. Handprint Fall tree paint your hand and arm and press onto a piece of paper no larger than 11x17 then paint on leaves using your fingers.
- 4. "Attract the bees" cereal necklace using cereal, create a necklace to attract the bumble bees.

5. Ripped paper fall tree — using a tree template, glue ripped pieces of construction paper onto it to fill it up.

Ages 3 & 4: PLEASE INDICATE AGE ON OUTSIDE OF ALL ENTRY TAGS AND THAT ALL RULES HAVE BEEN READ AND FOLLOWED.

- 6. Handprint Fall tree paint your hand and arm and press onto a piece of paper no larger than 11x17 then paint on leaves using your fingers.
- 7. Leaf Creatures Find different leaves, glue onto construction paper, then using any medium create your own creatures. Come up with a name for them.
- 8. Popcorn Trees Using sticks and popcorn make your own fall tree, either free standing or attached to paper.
- 9. Bubble wrap honeycomb Paint bubble wrap and press onto construction paper to create a honeycomb.
- 10. Cereal Bee using a bee template, glue on cereal and get creative.
- 11. Egg Carton Bee using an egg carton and any medium make 2 little bumblebees.

Ages 5 - 7: PLEASE INDICATE AGE ON OUTSIDE OF ALL ENTRY TAGS AND THAT ALL RULES HAVE BEEN READ AND FOLLOWED.

- 12. Bumblebee Mask using any medium make a bumble bee mask.
- 13. Leaf Rubbings Using a variety of leafs and crayons make a beautiful leaf rubbing picture.
- 14. Painted Rock Bumblebee Using a rock no bigger than 4" paint it to look like a bumblebee.
- 15. Fall Leaf Wreath Using any medium create a fall leaf wreath to hang on your front door not to exceed 18".
- 16. Bubble blowing Honeycomb using a cup and straw blow bubbles to cascade over the edge of the cup and fall onto your paper creating a honeycomb look.
- 17. Fall Coloured or Bumblebee inspired friendship bracelet using different beads and your theme create a bracelet for your friend.
- 18. Play dough Fall Tree using play dough and any other medium create a fall tree display on a small plate.

Ages 8 -11: PLEASE INDICATE AGE ON OUTSIDE OF ALL ENTRY TAGS AND THAT ALL RULES HAVE BEEN READ AND FOLLOWED.

- 19. 3D Beehive marble maze Create a maze using a piece of cardboard or box no bigger than 24" x 12". Using any medium get the bumblebee from the garden back to the beehive.
- 20. Fair themed coaster set (4) Using popsicle sticks create and decorate a set of coasters that are related to the fair theme. Please mount on Bristol board.

- 21. Leaf Creatures Find different leaves, glue onto construction paper, then using any medium create your own creatures. Come up with a name for them. Not to exceed 12x12.
- 22. Recycled Bumblebee in a tree Using any recycled items, create a bumblebee in a tree. Not to exceed 12 x 18.
- 23. Finger Puppets Using an old glove create a beehive on the palm and bumblebees on each finger using any medium.
- 24. Your best printing The Bumblebee Poem. On a piece of lined paper, print the following poem, highlight the vowels and decorate accordingly.

The Bumble Bee Buzz Buzz Buzz said the bumblebee, Here he comes he is after me! Oh no he's not, for I can see, He's on his way to the Apple tree.

Ages 12-16: PLEASE INDICATE AGE ON OUTSIDE OF ALL ENTRY TAGS AND THAT ALL RULES HAVE BEEN READ AND FOLLOWED.

- 25. Fall Door Wreath using any medium create a fall wreath to hang on your front door.
- 26. Colouring Page colour a picture from an adult colouring book and mount on Construction paper.
- 27. Anti-Bullying poster on a half sheet of Bristol board, (not to exceed 11x17) design a powerful message to promote Anti-Bullying.
- 28. Types of Bees Create 3 types of bees out of any medium, display and label their body parts.
- 29. A Forest of Fall trees using a piece of canvas not to exceed 12x12. Place painter's tape on the canvas to create the trees. Next paint over the tape making a fall forest. Once dried remove tape revealing your finished product.

- 30. Create a Terrarium out of any medium with at least 2 succulents and have the fair theme present.
- 31. 4 varieties of apples labelled and displayed creatively.
- 32. Collection of fresh fall coloured flowers and display in a suitable container.

Junior Photography: Photos must have been taken by the exhibitor. Include one print only in each section mounted on construction paper with a one inch border. Not to exceed 5 x 7. PLEASE INDICATE AGE ON OUTSIDE OF ALL ENTRY TAGS AND THAT ALL RULES HAVE BEEN READ AND FOLLOWED.

- 34. Best vacation memory.
- 35. Photo from previous Fair.
- 36. A flower close up.
- 37. Fall coloured leaf.
- 38. A tree from a different angle.
