SECTION: ROOTS AND VEGETABLES

1. Potatoes, 5 early variety, named and unwashed
2. Potatoes, 5 late variety, named and unwashed
3. Potatoes, 5 red, named and unwashed
4. Broccoli, 2 heads
5. Tallest stock of corn (no roots)
6. Largest potato by weight
7. Tallest sunflower plant (no roots)
8. Beets, 3 table, trim tops 3/4" or 2 cm above crown
9. Brussel sprouts, filled 1 pint (500 ml) box
10. Cabbage, 1 head
11. Cabbage, red, 1 head
12. Carrots, 3 table, trim tops to 1/2" (1.25 cm) above crown
13. Cauliflower, 1 head
14. Corn, ornamental, 3 ears
15. Cherry tomatoes, filled 1 pint box (500 ml), stems attached
16. Cucumber, 3 table, stems attached
17. Garlic, 3 bulbs, trim tops and roots to 1 - 1 1/2" (2.5 cm)
18. Peppers, 3 red sweet, stems attached
19. Onions, Yellow Danver, 3, trim tops and roots 1 - 2" (2.5 - 5 cm)
20. Onions, Spanish, grown from seed, 3, trim tops and roots 1 - 2" (2.5 - 5 cm)
21. Parsnips, 3, trim tops 1/2" (1.5 cm)
22. Pie Pumpkin, 1
23. Pumpkin, Jack O'Lantern variety, 1
24. Tomatoes, 3, stems attached
25. Tomatoes, different colours, 4 varieties, 2 of each
26. Squash, Butternut, 1, stem attached

27. Squash, Turks Turban, 1, stem attached
28. Squash, Pepper, 1, stem attached
29. Squash, Zucchini, 3 small, stem attached
30. Squash, Zucchini, largest by weight
31. Squash, Zucchini, largest by length
32. Squash, Hubbard, largest by weight
33. Flowering Kale
34. Table Centre Piece – A collection of gourds to be displayed in exhibitor's wicker basket
35. Weirdest shaped root or vegetable
