INSTRUCTIONS: All entries must be in the Exhibit Hall by 10:00 am Friday of the Fair and may be picked up AFTER closing ceremonies, 4:00 pm on Monday of the Fair upon presentation of exhibitor's card to the director in charge. **Please refer to rule #5 in the Homecraft Rules & Regulations on pg. 96.** Should there be more than **(6) SIX** entries in any section, and on the advice of the judge, a 4th prize will be given.

SECTIONS:

1. Maple syrup – light approx. 1 pt. (500 ml) in a SEALED glass jar.
2. Maple syrup – medium approx. 1 pt. (500 ml) in a SEALED glass jar.
3. Maple syrup – dark approx. 1 pt. (500 ml) in a SEALED glass jar.
4. Liquid honey – approx. 1 pt. (500 ml) in a glass jar.
5. Creamed honey – approx. 1 pt. (500 ml) in a glass jar.
6. Herb Vinegar – 1/2 pt. 250 ml bottle. Label to tell name of herb used.
7. Fruit Vinegar – 1/2 pt. 250 ml bottle. Label to tell name of fruit used.
8. Hen Eggs – 1 dozen in a carton - white. Show **clearly** the name of the breed with entry.
9. Hen Eggs – 1 dozen in a carton - brown. Show **clearly** the name of the breed with entry.
10. Largest Hen Egg – displayed in a suitable egg cup with the name of the breed of hen.
11. Smallest Fowl Egg – displayed with name of breed from which it came.
12. Display of 6 eggs from any other farm fowl, ie. bantams, guineas, ducks. Must be displayed and clearly named.
13. Collection of feathers from at least 3 rural fowl ie. guineas, bantams, peacocks, ducks, geese. Must be named and displayed in a vase.
14. Egg Shell – decorated to represent a well known character. Must be named and suitably displayed ie. Charlie Brown, Goldilocks, etc.
15. A basket, no larger than 12", decorated using the Fair Theme **"Bounty from the County"**
16. Potpourri – suitably displayed in glass container. **NO** perfume or cologne to be used. Attach a list of flowers, herbs or spices used.

17. Home-dried Fruit – displayed in a glass jar. Attach list of ingredients.
18. Home-dried Vegetables – displayed in a glass jar. Attach a list of ingredients.
19. Any article made with Corn Husks ie. doll, wreath.
20. Wreath – made from home grown products (no tree cones). **One** ribbon allowed.
21. Any article using dried apples. ie. doll, wreath
22. Create a centre piece using the Fair Theme "**Bounty from the County**"
No larger than 12" (30cm).

PRIZE MONEY: Sections 1 to 19: 1st \$5, 2nd \$4, 3rd \$3, 4th \$2

A Special Award of \$20 will be given to the exhibitor with most points in Sections 1-22, **sponsored by ERIN AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY.** To be presented in the Exhibits Hall, Centre Stage during closing ceremonies beginning at 4:00 pm, Monday of Fair.

INSTRUCTIONS: All flowers and plants entered for competition must have been grown by the exhibitor except in arrangement classes where purchased flowers and material are permitted. ENTRY TAGS MUST BE TIED (NOT TAPED) TO EXHIBIT. NO SILK FLOWERS OR ARTIFICIAL MATERIAL ALLOWED UNLESS REQUESTED. PLEASE REMOVE DAMAGED, DISCOLOURED, AND DEAD MATERIALS. ALSO READ PRIZE LIST CAREFULLY AND BE SURE THAT YOUR EXHIBIT IS ENTERED IN THE CORRECT SECTION. ALL ARRANGEMENTS MUST BE ASSEMBLED BEFORE ARRIVAL AT THE EXHIBITS HALL. Judge's Hint: Flowers and foliage should be almost at peak or peak condition and never past peak.

Should there be more than (6) six entries in any section and on the advice of the judge, a 4th prize of \$2 will be given. For changes in entries please contact the Secretary. Each exhibitor shall present his or her member's ticket when picking up exhibits for the hall at the conclusion of the fair.
