INSTRUCTIONS: This section is open to anyone with a physical or developmental disability. All projects may be completed using hand over hand if needed. There is no age limit for this section; all crafts can be completed by any age person. For further rules and information, please read the instructions CLASS 44 Junior Crafts. All entries must be in the Exhibit Hall by 10:00 am Friday of the Fair and may be picked up AFTER closing ceremonies, 4:00 pm on Monday of the Fair.

SECTION:

1. "Bounty from the County" collage – using pictures that would describe the fair theme, create a collage – not to exceed 8 1/2" x 11".
2. Seed, Bean and Grain Picture – using a heavier piece of paper, create an interesting picture or design using only seeds and grains – not to exceed 8 1/2" x 11"
3. Create an animal out of a fruit or vegetable
4. Thanksgiving Harvest Basket – using a basket not to exceed 12", create a display using fruits, vegetables and flowers.
5. Wooden Spoon Farm Animal – using a wooden spoon and any medium create any animal that you would see on a farm.
6. Friendship Bracelet or Necklace – make a one-of-a-kind friendship bracelet or a fantastic necklace using beads or other decorations.
7. Clay Pot Spider – use any medium and a 3" or 4" clay pot to create a Hallowe'en spider
8. Fruit and Vegetable Prints – using different pieces of fruit and vegetables dip them into paint and press onto a sheet of paper- not to exceed 12" x 18"
9. Shaker – fill a glass jar with popcorn kernels, lentils or beans. Decorate the jar using tissue paper and ribbons in fall colours.
10. Finger Print Apple Tree – use your arm and hand as the trunk and branches and your fingers as apples and leaves. Not to exceed 12" x 12"
11. Toilet Paper Cob of Corn – using a toilet paper or paper towel roll, construction paper and paint or markers, create a cob of corn.

12. Tallest Bean Sprout – plant a bean in a small pot and watch it grow. The tallest plant will win first prize!

PHOTOGRAPHY:

Photos can be taken by someone else but mounted and/or framed by the exhibitor. Creative mounting is encouraged.

13. A photograph of a field of crops. Not to exceed 5" x 7"

14. A photograph of a barn. Not to exceed 5" x 7"

15. A photograph of a vegetable or flower garden. Not to exceed 5" x 7"

16. Biggest Maple Leaf – Search around for the biggest Maple leaf you can find and mount it onto a piece of construction paper or bristol board.
