No person shall be permitted to enter more than one article per section in each class. **Please refer to rule #5 in the Homecraft Rules & Regulations on pg. 96.** Due to limited space we request exhibitors use the smallest plate or tray appropriate to the size and number of vegetables.

### **SECTION: ROOTS AND VEGETABLES**

1. Potatoes, 5 early variety, named and unwashed
2. Potatoes, 5 late variety, named and unwashed
3. Potatoes, 5 red, named and unwashed
4. Largest potato by weight
5. Beets, 3 table, trim tops 3/4" or 2 cm above crown
6. Tallest stock of corn (no roots)
7. Tallest sunflower plant (no roots)
8. Cabbage, 1 head
9. Cabbage, red, 1 head
10. Carrots, 3 table, trim tops to 1/2" (1.25 cm) above crown
11. Corn, ornamental, 3 ears
12. Cherry tomatoes, 10, stems attached
13. Cucumber, 3 table, stems attached
14. Garlic, 3 bulbs, trim tops and roots to 1 - 1 1/2" (2.5 cm)
15. Onions, Yellow Danver, 3, trim tops and roots 1 - 2" (2.5 - 5 cm)
16. Onions, Spanish, grown from seed, 3, trim tops and roots 1 - 2" (2.5 - 5 cm)
17. Parsnips, 3, trim tops 1/2" (1.5 cm)
18. Pie Pumpkin, 1
19. Pumpkin, Jack O'Lantern variety, 1
20. Tomatoes, 3, stems attached
21. Tomatoes, different colours, 4 varieties, 2 of each
22. Squash, Butternut, 1, stem attached
23. Squash, Turks Turban, 1, stem attached
24. Squash, Pepper, 1, stem attached
25. Squash, Zucchini, largest by weight

26. Squash, Zucchini, largest by length
27. Squash, Hubbard, largest by weight
28. Flowering Kale
29. Table Centre Piece – A collection of gourds to be displayed in exhibitor’s wicker basket
30. Weirdest Shaped Root or Vegetable

31. Collection of 5 Varieties of Apples (minimum 3 of each suitably displayed in wicker container)
