INSTRUCTIONS: The Junior sections are for boys and girls who have reached their 16th birthday by the end of the fall fair year. Please fill out the information on the entry cards and **include the child's age to be visible when the card is folded in its closed position.** Fasten entry tags securely to all entries. No entries will be accepted for more than two years. All entries must be the work of the child.

Parents are encouraged to allow the children to prepare the exhibits without assistance. Please encourage them in every way, but remember that every bit of work you do for them defeats the objectives of the Fair.

Only one entry per section per child permitted and children must exhibit in their own age group only. **ALL PICTURES AND PAINTINGS MADE ON PAPER MUST NOT EXCEED 8½ x 11 INCHES UNLESS OTHERWISE NOTED. PLEASE READ INSTRUCTIONS FOR EACH SECTION AS THEY WILL BE DISQUALIFIED IF NOT MADE TO THE APPROPRIATE SIZE.** No exhibitor fee is required, however all exhibitors must obtain an exhibit number before entering their items. **Entries must be placed in the Exhibit Hall by 10:00 am Friday and not removed until 4:45 pm Monday following the Awards presentation.** Please ensure that you arrange to have your entries picked up as we cannot be responsible for them after Monday.

Examples of any medium, would be; paint, markers, crayons, pencil crayons, oil pastels, bingo dabbers, chalk, ribbon, yarn, string, lace, feathers, buttons, pompoms, stickers, paper, fabric, noodles, shells, puzzle pieces, flowers, beads, sparkles, sequins, tooth picks, pipe cleaners, googly eyes, popsicle sticks, foam pieces, clothespins, wooden spoons, dice, play dough, felt, sponges, elastics, milk tags, gimp, items from nature, cotton balls, egg cartons, candies, etc.

Ages 2 and under: PLEASE INDICATE AGE ON OUTSIDE OF ALL ENTRY TAGS AND MAKE SURE ALL RULES HAVE BEEN READ AND FOLLOWED.

1. Largest Maple Leaf – find the biggest maple leaf you can and glue onto construction paper.
2. Painted Pet Rock – find a rock no bigger than 4" and create a pet using paint.
3. Pine Cone Critter – decorate a pine cone with any medium to create a farm animal.

4. Hand Print Turkey – paint child’s hand to look like a turkey and press onto a piece of paper.
5. Ripped Paper Pumpkin – using pieces of ripped construction paper glue onto a pumpkin shape.
6. Marble Painting – place a piece of paper into a box with lid, add paint randomly and marbles, close lid and let child shake the marbles all around to create a picture.

Ages 3 & 4: PLEASE INDICATE AGE ON OUTSIDE OF ALL ENTRY TAGS AND THAT ALL RULES HAVE BEEN READ AND FOLLOWED.

7. Sock Puppet – using a sock and any medium make a puppet ready for the show.
8. Leaf Necklace – using different types of leaves string together to make a necklace.
9. Letter “T” collage – cut out pictures that start with the letter “T” and glue onto a small paper plate.
10. Painting with nature objects – using a variety of objects found in nature create a one of a kind print.
11. Musical Instrument – using an old toilet paper tube, fill with beans, or rice and decorate.
12. Hand Print Turkey – paint child’s hand to look like a turkey and press onto a piece of paper.

Ages 5 - 7: PLEASE INDICATE AGE ON OUTSIDE OF ALL ENTRY TAGS AND THAT ALL RULES HAVE BEEN READ AND FOLLOWED.

13. Popsicle Stick Picture Frame – using popsicle sticks and any medium create a picture frame ready for a 4x6 picture.
14. Paper Bag Puppet of Grand Parent – create a puppet of your grandparent using a paper bag (lunch sized) and any other medium, include picture for reference.
15. Collage of New and Old Buildings – create a collage covering all of your paper with new and old buildings (May use magazines or pictures from internet).
16. Pine Cone Turkey – find a pine cone and create your best turkey.
17. Beaded Pipe Cleaner Pumpkin – using pipe cleaners and beads create a free standing pumpkin.
18. Press, label and mount 4 different leaf types.

Ages 8 -11: PLEASE INDICATE AGE ON OUTSIDE OF ALL ENTRY TAGS AND THAT ALL RULES HAVE BEEN READ AND FOLLOWED.

19. Pine Cone and Nature Wreath – using any medium make and decorate a natural wreath ready to hang on your front door not to exceed 18” x 18”

20. Computer Designed "Thanks" giving card – using any type of computer program, design a one of a kind "Thanks" giving card not to exceed 4" x 6".
21. Pressed Flowers – using 6 different varieties of pressed flowers, mount and label creatively not to exceed 11" x 17"
22. Collage of Rural and Urban Living – create a collage using magazines or pictures found on the internet of rural and urban living.
23. Tape Resist Canvas Painting – using a canvas not to exceed 11"x17", tape off a design and then paint the open spots creating a neat affect once the tape is removed.
24. Paper Plate Dream Catcher – using a paper plate create a dream catcher ready to hang over your bed.

Ages 12-16: PLEASE INDICATE AGE ON OUTSIDE OF ALL ENTRY TAGS AND THAT ALL RULES HAVE BEEN READ AND FOLLOWED.

25. Handmade Card – (any occasion) using pressed flowers. Create a card not to exceed 4"x6" using pressed flowers.
26. Mad Lib Thanksgiving Story (limited to 8 1/2 x 11 sized paper) – create a Thanksgiving Mad lib story leaving blanks open for judge to fill in.
27. Corn Husk Doll – using a corn husk create a doll and decorate in Pioneer type clothing
28. Any knitted or crocheted Article.
29. Pioneer breakfast made from playdough or clay displayed on a paper plate.
30. Any Tie-Dyed Article

Junior Gardening & Horticulture: PLEASE INDICATE AGE ON OUTSIDE OF ALL ENTRY TAGS AND THAT ALL RULES HAVE BEEN READ AND FOLLOWED.

31. Down Memory Lane – a collection of dried Natural materials in an unusual container.
32. 3 Marigolds any variety displayed in a mason jar
33. Oddest shaped vegetable grown by child.

Junior Photography: Photos must have been taken by the exhibitor. Include one print only in each section mounted on construction paper with a one inch border. Not to exceed 5" x 7". PLEASE INDICATE AGE ON OUTSIDE OF ALL ENTRY TAGS AND THAT ALL RULES HAVE BEEN READ AND FOLLOWED.
