INSTRUCTIONS: This section is open to anyone with a physical or developmental disability. All projects may be completed using hand over hand if needed. There is no age limit for this section; all crafts can be completed by any age person. For further rules and information, please read the instructions CLASS 44 Junior Crafts. All entries must be in the Exhibit Hall by 10:00 am Friday of the Fair and may be picked up AFTER closing ceremonies, 4:00 pm on Monday of the Fair.

SECTION:

1. Paper Plate Turtle – Create a turtle using tissue paper, paint, construction paper or markers on a 9" or 12" paper plate. You may add detail using other mediums.
2. Seed, Bean and Grain Picture – Using a heavier piece of paper, create an interesting picture or design using only seeds and grains – not to exceed 8 1/2" x 11"
3. Caterpillar Print – Dip a round sponge or cork in different colour paints to create a caterpillar on a piece of cardboard or paper. You may add detail using other mediums. Not to exceed 11" x 17".
4. Thanksgiving Harvest Basket – Using a basket not to exceed 12", create a display using fruits, vegetables and flowers.
5. Leaf Collage – Find different colour leaves and create a colourful collage on a piece of paper or cardboard. Not to exceed 11" x 17".
6. Pine Cone Apple Tree – Mount any size pine cone onto a base (ie. spool of thread). Decorate with any medium to create a fall apple tree. Pom Poms and yarn are permitted.
7. Clay Pot Alien – Use any mediums and a 3" or 4" clay pot to create an alien from Mars.
8. Egg carton flowers – Using paint and an egg carton, create three colourful flowers. Use pencils for the stems. Put in a mason jar. Jar may be decorated with any medium.
9. Clothespin Animal – Using a clothespin and any mediums, create a clothespin animal or insect.
10. Hand Print Turkey – use your palm and fingers to create a Thanksgiving turkey. Not to exceed 12" x 12" .

11. Toilet Paper Roll Butterfly – using a toilet paper roll or paper towel roll, construction paper, tissue paper and paint or markers, create a beautiful butterfly.
12. Plant – Plant a seed in a small pot and watch it grow. The tallest plant will win first prize!

PHOTOGRAPHY:

Photos can be taken by someone else but mounted and/or framed by the exhibitor. Creative mounting is encouraged.

13. A photograph of antique farm equipment or tractor. Not to exceed 5" x 7"
14. A photograph of you next to a flower or vegetable garden. Not to exceed 5" x 7"
15. A photograph of you with a family member. Not to exceed 5" x 7"

16. Biggest Maple Leaf – Search around for the biggest maple leaf you can find and mount it onto a piece of construction paper or bristol board.
